You will also need a Kingsley blue overall for Art and Science lessons!




You will be informed of your swimming day soon. Along with the items below, we recommend that you bring spare pants and socks, just in case.

FOREST SCHOOL

One afternoon a week we spend time at Forest School. We learn about nature and use our senses to discover sights, smells, sounds and textures. We also learn about different types of knots; learn how to use tools to chop, saw and whittle; create fire balls and fire cups for tinder for our camp fire; and build dens, zip wires and different types of obstacle courses to challenge ourselves and others. These are just some of the amazing experiences we have!

You will need long leggings/trouser, long sleeved top, waterproof top and bottoms, walking boots or wellington boots, hat, snood/gaiter and gloves. These do not need to have the school logo on them.

WHAT DO WE EAT?



We need to drink water during our school day. You can bring a reusable bottle of water to school. This can be filled up from the tap in the classroom. Make sure your bottle of water is **clear** and is **named**.

We need a snack every day to eat at break time. These should be balanced and varied and must not contain nuts (Please label snack boxes with names!)

We have a delicious and varied menu at The Kingsley School. We always have a hot lunch like roast beef or lasagne. There is often the option of pasta or a jacket potato, with a salad bar, too. There is always plenty to choose from.

ENRICHMENT

Enrichment activities are built into the timetable at 3.20pm every day of the week, except on Fridays. These sessions are optional for younger pupils, however Key Stage 2 pupils should participate in one activity each day. There is a whole programme of activities and clubs to choose and join, which will change throughout the year. You might like to continue with some familiar activities, or this could be an opportunity to try a new activity and meet new friends!

Enrichment options may include...
